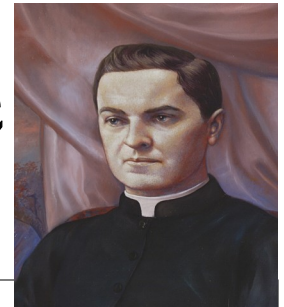

**PRO-LIFE** Primary elections are just around the corner. Here's a call to action for Knights and families. More than 170 years ago French philosopher Alexis de Toqueville wrote, "I sought for the greatness and genius of America in her commodious harbors and her ample rivers, and it was not there; in her fertile fields and boundless prairies, and it was not there; in her rich mines and her vast world commerce, and it was not there. Not until I went to the churches of America and heard her pulpits aflame with righteousness did I understand the secret of her genius and power, America is great because she is good, and if America ever ceases to be good, America will cease to be great."

Jesus said we should be a light in the darkness. We should practice what we preach. Our Declaration of Independence affirms, "We hold these truths to be self-evident, that all men are created equal, that they are endowed with certain inalienable rights, that among these are the RIGHT TO LIFE, liberty and the pursuit of happiness."

Abortion, euthanasia, the death penalty, all violate the first and essential right—the right to life. Abortion isn't a right, despite judicial opinions that say it is. The Pope says we have no obligation to obey such "laws." Laws are made by legislators, our senators and representatives, and signed by the chief executive of our nation or state. Courts can't make laws.

The Popes, the Bishops tell us we have a sacred religious duty to exercise our citizenship, a responsibility to shape our politics, our culture as God says.
