Brother Knights, we had great success last year with hard work and determination from all involved. We must keep our momentum going to attain all our goals again this year. This should be an exciting year. We have many goals to achieve and with your help and determination we will accomplish all of them.

Our main goal is for Kansas to attain the coveted Circle of Honor status again this year. We also need every council to be active in both programming and membership this fraternal year. Our state goal is 1650 new members by June 30, 2011. How can we achieve this? We must ask and invite every eligible Catholic man and their family to join us. 2010 Silver Rose Run

The Our Lady of Guadalupe Silver Rose Program began in 1960 as a project of the Columbian Squires of North America to honor the Blessed Virgin under her title of Our Lady of Guadalupe Patroness of the Americas. In 2001 Supreme Knight Carl A Anderson expanded the program by beginning the Running of the Rose from the 119th Annual meeting of the Supreme Council in Ontario.

Throughout this year there will be three roses traveling simultaneously, starting in London, Ontario and then moving to west coast, central United States and the east coast. All three roses will meet at the same time in Texas to travel over the International Bridge and be handed over to Knights from Monterey.

The State of Kansas will receive one of the three roses starting September 5 and move on to Missouri on September 26. Each day there will be a mass and/or prayer service with the rose. Below is the date, location and district deputy in charge.
